Directions:

1. Using the construction paper that was given to you (or any other paper you choose...be creative!) create a pretend book jacket. A book jacket is the sleeve that fits over a hardcover book. For a more rigid book cover you can use poster board as a base.

2. On the front cover:
 - a. Include the title, author, your name, and an illustration from the book. Be neat, creative, and have fun illustrating!

3. On the spine:

- a. include the title, the last name of the author, and the number of pages in your book

4. On the back cover:

- a. Write a summary of the book. Be sure to include information about the important characters, the setting, the problem, and the solution.

5. On the front inside flap:

- a. include a review of the book telling what you thought of it. Be specific! Tell WHY you liked or didn't like the book. You can include other personal thoughts or reflections about the book in this space.

6. On the back inside flap:

- a. Create an "About the Author" section. Include information such as: where they live, details about his/her life, other written works, awards and/or other achievements, and other interesting facts.
